



## Parenthetical Citations Checklist

- For parenthetical citations use author's last name when available (Myers).
- If the author is not available, use the first two or three words of the title, in quotation marks for an article or italicized if a book:  
("Universal Benefits").  
(*Writing Research Papers*).
- If citing from a book, include the page number(s) after the title:  
(*Writing Research Papers* 44).
- When citing two articles by the same author, cite them by author's last name and then abbreviated title:  
(Myers *Writing Research Papers*).  
(Myers *Writing Research Papers* 44).
- When citing an article by two or three authors, name all of them and separate with a comma: (Smith, Johnson, and Nelson). For four or more authors, state the first one and follow by et al., like this: (Smith et al.). Follow by the page number if applicable as necessary, like this: (Smith et al. 35).
- All parenthetical citations correspond to a citation on the Works Cited page.
- No comma between the author and page number. **Wrong:** (Myers, 44).
