The Scarlet Letter

- Author: Nathaniel Hawthorne (1804-1864)
 - born in Salem, Massachusetts as Nathaniel Hathorne
 - relative of Puritan Judge John Hathorne, a notorious judge in the Salem witch trials.
 - because of guilt and fear of association with his ancestors, Hawthorne added a 'w' into his last name





- Author: Nathaniel Hawthorne (1804-1864)
 - graduated from Bowdoin College in 1825
 - wrote novels and short stories, but to supplement his income he worked as an inspector at the Boston Custom House
 - married Sophia Peabody in 1842





- Author: Nathaniel Hawthorne (1804-1864)
 - served as Consul to England for a short time before his health started failing
 - died on May 18, 1864
 - today, Hawthorne stands as one of America's greatest writers





- About the novel:
 - Set in 17th century Boston
 - Strict Puritan belief system (think back to Lit. of Religion!)
 - Maín characters: Hester Prynne, Pearl, Rev. Dímmesdale, Roger Chillingworth
 - Novel spans 7 years



- Líke other Purítan settlements in New England, the local and colonial governments were <u>theocracies</u>
- A <u>theocracy</u> is a government where the civil laws are based (in whole or in part) on religious laws; civil leaders in theocracies are probably also important religious leaders
- Because Puritan Boston was a theocratic society, crime against church (or God) was the equivalent of a crime against another person or against "the State."





- Background info:
 - Protagoníst Hester Prynne gíves bírth to a baby gírl, Pearl.
 Her husband, however, has been míssing for many years.
 - The town punishes Hester for her adultery; she is sent to prison and then forced to wear a scarlet letter A on her clothes for the rest of her life.





- Background info:
 - Hester refuses to identify the father of her baby
 - Her lover seems to escape punishment...but, will his internal suffering prove worse than public shame???

The Custom House

- The introductory chapter to The Scarlet Letter is called "The Custom House".
- Nathaníel Hawthorne tells of hís tíme as a clerk ín the Salem, Mass. Government Custom House.
- He claims to have found a letter written by Hester Prynne (the novel's main character) and an embroidered scarlet A. The letter tells of Hester's experiences, which Hawthorne relates in the novel.
- The novel is NOT based in historical fact, but Hawthorne uses "The Custom House" to give his story credibility.
